## 2) Lentowski Reflects on 47 Years Leading Conservation Foundation

Jim Lentowski, a long-time hero of conservation on Nantucket, is officially retired, after 47 years leading the organization that today protects more than 9,000 acres of open space across the island, including Sanford Farm, Tupancy Links, Squam Farm and Swamp, the Milestone and Windswept cranberry bogs, Norwood Farm and the University of Massachusetts-Boston's Nantucket Field Station in Quaise.

"What's next? After 47 years of working to create, from the bottom up, a one-of-a-kind program that reflects the founders' goal to preserve Nantucket's unique natural character, it's time to stop, wind down and consider how best I can use my experience, contacts and interests in the years ahead," Lentowski, 71, said. # 3) Mass Rivers & Other Watershed Groups Move U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to Protect Water Quality

Excerpts from Mass Rivers Alliance, July 3, 2018

Following a lawsuit by environmental groups, a long-awaited federal stormwater permit went into effect for Massachusetts on July 3, 2018. The permit requires municipalities to take additional steps to protect rivers, lakes, streams and ponds from polluted stormwater runoff. Contaminated stormwater is the state's top water pollution problem.

"This is a major victory for water quality throughout the Commonwealth," said Julia Blatt, Executive Director of the Massachusetts Rivers Alliance. "During a time when environmental protections are under wholesale attack, I am relieved that we were able to successfully defend Massachusetts' residents' right to clean water." # 11) Massachusetts Forest Legacy Program

September 10, 2018 deadline

The Massachusetts Forest Legacy Program is now accepting project proposals for consideration in the Federal Fiscal Year 2020 application process. The Forest Legacy Program is a partnership between the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation and the USDA Forest Service to protect environmentally important forests from conversion to non-forest uses. The Federal government may fund up to 75% of project costs, with at least 25% coming from private, state or local sources. The MA Forest Legacy Program FY 2020 Request for Proposals application instructions are posted <a href="here">here</a>. The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation (NFWF) is pleased to announce the National Coastal Resilience Fund.
